
HALF –TERM EASTER HOLIDAY PROJECT

In the summer term you will be provided with an opportunity to share a hobby or passion that you are hugely interested and passionate about. You might be passionate about a sport, a game, reading, writing, art, D & T, sewing, cooking, anything! We are looking for passions that are maybe unique to you and paint a picture of your personal character. It is a celebration of you!

Create a booklet using just **one piece of A4 card or paper** that introduces your passion to your teacher and your peers. The booklet can be folded (or cut) anyway you prefer but make sure you use each space effectively with maximum effort required in terms of detail and quality. Type **'foldable books'** into Google and you will find a variety of ways to use just one piece of paper or card. It can be handwritten/drawn or completed on a word-processor. The booklet should be entitled **'My Passion'**. Please look to answer the following questions using sub-headings and bullet points to organise your information.

- **What is your passion? Explain it in detail.**
- **Why do you like it so much?**
- **What is the history of your passion? E.g. Who invented it? When did it become popular? How has it grown in popularity (if at all)? Etc.**
- **Does anybody famous also enjoy your passion? Who are your favourites and why?**
- **In summary, why do you think others should share your passion?**
