This week's homework will help the children consolidate their understanding of money, addition and word problems.



Exploding Bonbons- £2.34

Jelly Slugs - £3.48

Fizzing Whizbees - £2.29

Honey Dukes - 62p each

Chocolate frog - £6.82

**When answering the questions you must show all of your working out!**

1. I buy a packet of Fizzing Whizbees and a packet of Jelly slugs. How much have I spent in total? How much change do I get from £10.00?
2. I buy my friend a packet of Jelly Slugs and 2 Honey Dukes. How much have I spent in total? What change will I get from £5.00?
3. Chocolate frogs have been reduced to half price. I buy 4 (half price). How much money have I spent? What change do I get from £20.00?
4. I have £10.00 to spend. I buy 1 chocolate frog and one packet of fizzing Whizbees. How much change do I have left?
5. I buy 10 Honey dukes and one packet of Jelly slugs. How much have I spent?
6. Exploding bonbons are now reduced to half price. If I buy 3, how much have I spent? What change would I get from a £10 note?
7. I buy one of each of the products. How much have I spent? What change would I get from a £20 note?
8. I buy 2 packets of Jelly slugs (normal price) and one chocolate frog (half price). How much have I spent? What change would I get from £20?

Extension:

1. I buy a cake for £12.46. How much wizard money would I need?
2. I buy a lollipop for £4.88. How much wizard money would I need?
3. I buy a jar of sweets for £43.64. How would I pay in wizard money?
4. I buy a magic slug for £2.48. How much would I pay in wizard money?
