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Message from Mrs Gallagher

Dear Parents and Carers,

The new school year is well underway and everyone has settled well into their new classes and routines. We have been very impressed with the children's readiness for the academic year. It is also very pleasing to hear that our previous Year 6, now in Year 7, are settling well into their new schools.

Welcome to all of our new children and families in the Nursery, Reception and year groups throughout the school. We hope that your family will enjoy St. Michael's School and all that we have to offer. We celebrated our new academic year and Michaelmas at St. Michael's Church. Year 4 led the service with excellent performances, singing and poetry. Please see the calendar for more upcoming exciting events.

We have five school values: endurance, koinonia, forgiveness, creation and friendship. We teach the children about the values and support each other in applying what we have learnt to our daily lives. Dear Parents and Carers,

Hopefully by now you will have received the letter Mrs. Gallagher and I sent to you offering an update on our open evening on the 25th September.

Without repeating what we said that letter, I would like to focus instead on two key timelines at work in this project.

The first is the construction phase itself. We expect to hire the professional support we need between now and the end of March 2020 – this will include searching for a qualified Project Advisor, a quantity surveyor or engineer who can provide oversight and advice for the entire project and make sure our interests are protected at all times.

We will aim to hire an architect during that time with a brief that will be based on the excellent work done by ex-Governor and architect Adam Zombory-Moldovan. Adam presented an initial plan on the 25th September and while final plans may be different, the key premise of keeping the ICT suite where it is and creating a standalone library will be kept. We will explore different design options and materials but Adam's vision of a light, elegant, high-ceilinged structure will provide the framework for the brief.

The ICT suite will be refurbished summer 2020 and we feel it important to get the library built no later than two years after that. Fundraising is made more challenging if the people paying do not directly see the fruits of their giving while their children are at the school.

The other timeline is financial. We have a window of 10 years when we will be receiving a substantial boost to our annual income via the Highgate Lane Agreement. We will need to prioritise projects but get the most important ones finished within that timeframe. Projects we are considering include: expanding the nursery, moving the office to the front of the school site and creating dedicated music rehearsal and intervention space.

But we cannot rely solely on the 10 year lane money. We really do need to mind the funding gap in the Governor's Fund and so you will be hearing more about this over the next few months. We will be appealing to the 236 parents and caregivers who currently do not give to the Governor's Fund to consider giving.

Finally if any parents or caregivers would like to get involved with this project there will be more than enough work to share and we would particularly welcome the support of anyone with specific building or fundraising skills.

Attendance


Please label all clothing items, bags and water bottles clearly to ensure items can be returned to the correct child.

Reception Lucia Bronze

Born 28 October 1991, Lucia is an English footballer who plays as a right-back for French club Olympique Lyonnais and the England national

team. She has previously p for Sunderland, Everton, Liverpool, and Manchester City.



She played in the 2015 World Cup, helping England to third place, and the 2019 World Cup in which they finished fourth. She has won the PFA Women's Players' Player of the Year award twice – in 2014, and again in 2017. In 2018, she was named BBC Women's Footballer of the Year. In 2019, she became the first English footballer to win the UEFA Women's Player of the Year Award. Bronze is widely regarded as the world's greatest right-back.

Year 4 Nadia Comaneci

Born on the 12th of November 1961, Nadia Comaneci is one of the best known and possibly greatest gymnasts of all time. Comaneci is an Olympic gold medallist having won Olympic gold 5 times in individual events. She is also the first ever gymnast to be awarded a perfect 10 in the Olympic Games.



Year 1 Usain Bolt

Jamaican sprinter Usain Bolt (born August 21, 1986) is arguably the fastest man in the world, winning three gold medals at the 2008 Olympic Games in Beijing, China, and becoming the first man in Olympic history to win both the 100-meter and 200-meter races in record times.

Bolt also won three Olympic gold medals at the 2012 Summer Olympic Games in London. He ran the men's

100-meter race in 9.63 seconds, a new Olympic record, making him the first man in history to set three world records in Olympic competition.

He made history again at the 2016 Summer Games in Rio when he won gold in the 100-meter and 200-meter race and 4×100 -meter relay, completing a "triple-triple," earning three gold medals at three consecutive Olympics for a total of 9 gold medals over the course of his Olympic career.



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Year 3 Ellie Simmonds

Welcome to Year 3 Simmonds. We have found out all about the phenomenally successful Paralympian swimmer Ellie Simmonds. She has won several gold medals and, incredibly, won her first Paralympic gold in Beijing at the age of thirteen. She is also a talented baker and was a star in The Celebrity Bake-Off tent. Inspired by both her swimming and baking talents, we decided to create our own recipes for success.



Year 4 Sachin Tendulkar


Sachin Tendulkar, born on the 24th of April 1973, is a former cricketer and captain of the Indian national team. Tendulkar is the highest run scorer of all time in international cricket, having scored just over 34000 runs. He was the first batsman to score 200 runs in a one day international game, he holds the record for most runs scored in a test match and is the **only** player to have scored 100



Nursery Serena Williams

Serena Williams, born 26th September 1981, an American tennis player and former No1 who revolutionized women's tennis with her powerful style of play and who won more Grand Slam singles titles (23) than any other woman or man during the open era.

Williams began intensive tennis training at the age of three. She won her first major championship in 1999 and completed the career Gland Slam in 2003. Along with her individual success, Serena has teamed with sister Venus Williams to win a series of doubles titles. In 2017, she defeated her big sister at the Australian Open to claim the 23rd Grand Slam singles title of her career.



Reception Pele

Edson Arantes do Nascimento, KBE born 23 October 1940), known as Pelé, is a Brazilian retired professional footballer who played as a forward. He is widely regarded as one of the greatest players of all time. In 1999, he was voted World Player of the Century by the International Federation of Football History & Statistics (IFFHS), and was one of the two joint winners of the FIFA Player of the Century award. That same year, Pelé was elected Athlete of the Century by the International Olympic Committee.

According to the IFFHS, Pelé is the most successful domestic league goal-scorer in football history scoring 650 goals in 694 League matches, and in total 1281 goals in 1363 games, which included unofficial friendlies and is a Guinness World Record. During his playing days, Pelé was for a period the best-paid athlete in the world.



Year 1 Tanni Grey-Thompson



Carys Davina Grey-Thompson, Baroness Grey-Thompson, DBE, DL (born 26 July 1969), known as Tanni Grey-Thompson, is a Welsh politician, television presenter and former wheelchair racer. She has also been the Chancellor of Northumbria University since July 2015.

Grey-Thompson was born with spina bifida and is a wheelchair user. She is one of the most successful disabled athletes in the UK.

Year 2 Lella Lombardi

Maria Grazia "Lella" Lombardi (26 March 1941 - 3 March 1992) was a racing driver from Italy.

Born in Frugarolo, Piedmont, she participated in 17 Formula One World Championship Grands Prix, debuting on 20 July 1974 and finishing her career with half a point. She is the only female Formula One driver in history to have a top six finish in a World Championship race, which she did at the 1975 Spanish Grand Prix^[] (Half points were awarded for this race due to a shortened race distance, hence Lombardi received half a point instead of the usual one point).




As well as being the sole female driver to score points in Formula One, she is one of two who qualified for a Formula One race (the other being compatriot Maria Teresa de Filippis) and the only driver with that career total.

Year 3 Ellie Simmonds

Eleanor May Simmonds, OBE (born 11 November 1994) is a British Paralympian swimmer competing in S6 events.

She came to national attention when she competed in the 2008 Summer Paralympics in Beijing, winning two gold medals for Great Britain, despite being the youngest member of the team, at the age of 13. In 2012, she was again selected for the Great Britain squad, this time swimming at a home games in London.







Year 5 Nicola Adams

Nicola Adams OBE (born 26 October 1982) is a British professional boxer who has held the WBO female flyweight title since July 2019.

She became the first female boxer to win an Olympic gold medal at London 2012, and the first female boxer to become a double Olympic champion after winning a second gold medal at Rio 2016, both in the flyweight division.

As of 27 May 2016 she is the reigning Olympic, World and European Games champion at flyweight, and has won the entire set of amateur championships available to her - Olympic, Commonwealth and European Games' titles, and the World, European and European Union championships.



Year 6 Jesse Owens

James Cleveland "Jesse" Owens (September 12, 1913 – March 31, 1980) was an American track and field athlete and four-time gold medallist in the 1936 Olympic Games.

Owens specialized in the sprints and the long jump, and was recognized in his lifetime as "perhaps the greatest and most famous athlete in track and field history". He set three world records and tied another, all in less than an hour at the 1935 Big Ten track meet in Ann Arbor, Michigan—a feat that has never been equalled and has been called "the greatest 45 minutes ever in sport".

He achieved international fame at the 1936 Summer Olympics in Berlin, Germany by winning four gold medals: 100 meters, 200 meters, long jump, and 4 \times 100 meter relay. He was the most successful athlete at the Games and, as a black man, was credited with "single-handedly crushing Hitler's myth of Aryan supremacy", although he "wasn't invited to the White House to shake hands with the President, either".



Year 2 Ellen MacArthur



Dame Ellen Patricia MacArthur, DBE (born 8 July 1976) is a retired English sailor, from Whatstandwell near Matlock in Derbyshire, now based in Cowes, Isle of Wight.

MacArthur is a successful solo longdistance yachtswoman. On 7 February 2005 she broke the world record for the fastest solo circumnavigation of the globe, a feat which

gained her international renown. Francis Joyon, the Frenchman who had held the record before MacArthur, was able to recover the record again in early 2008.

Year 6 Yuna Kim

Yuna Kim (born September 5, 1990), also credited in eastern name order as Kim Yuna or Kim Yeon-ah, is a South Korean former competitive figure skater. She is the 2010 Olympic champion and 2014 silver medallist in ladies' singles; the 2009 & 2013 World champion; the 2009 Four Continents champion; a three-time (2006–2007, 2007–2008, 2009–2010) Grand Prix Final champion; the 2006 World Junior champion; the 2005 Junior Grand Prix Final champion; and a six-time (2003, 2004, 2005, 2006, 2013, 2014) South Korean national champion.



Kim is the first South Korean figure skater to win a medal at an ISU Junior Grand Prix or ISU Grand Prix of Figure Skating event, ISU Figure Skating Championships, and The Olympic Games. She is the first female skater ever to win and complete every official ISU grand slam figure skating titles namely: The Olympic Games, the World Championships, the Four Continents Championships, and the Grand Prix Final.

As a result of her numerous accomplishments, she is frequently referred to as Queen Yuna by various media across the world.

Year 3 Jonah Lomu

Jonah Tali Lomu MNZM (12 May 1975 – 18 November 2015) was a New Zealand rugby union player. He became the youngest ever All Black when he played his first international in 1994 at the age of 19 years and 45 days. Playing on the wing Lomu finished his international career with 63 caps and 37 tries. He is regarded as the first true global superstar of rugby and consequently had a huge impact on the game. Lomu was inducted into the International Rugby Hall of Fame on 9 October 2007, and the IRB Hall of Fame on 24 October 2011.



Lomu burst onto the international rugby scene during the 1994 Hong Kong Sevens tournament, the same year he made his fifteen-a-side debut. He was widely acknowledged as the top player at the 1995 World Cup in South Africa even though New

Year 5 George Pilkington-Mills

George Pilkington Mills DSO (8 January 1867 – 8 November 1945^[1]) was the dominant English racing cyclist of his generation, and winner of the inaugural Bordeaux–Paris cycle race. He frequently rode from Land's End to John o' Groats, holding the world record time on six occasions between 1886 and 1895. He was a member of the Anfield and North Road cycling clubs. He later won races and broke records as a car racer and motorcycle rider. [1]



I make no secret of the fact that I know nothing about football. I do not watch it and have never played it. I do, however, greatly enjoy supporting the children and it was therefore with real pleasure that I attended the Year 3 football tournament at Highgate School on Saturday 28th September.
