Homework Project - Significant Figures!




This Summer term we had planned to have a special dress-up day to celebrate the installation of the magnificent and beautiful timeline in the KS1 Playground.

HOWEVER we want you to get thinking about who you would like to dress-up as by completing a project of a significant person from history. This can be someone from very recent history like the climate change activist Greta Thunberg or going much further back in time to the ancient Greek poet Homer.

Your project will consist of three parts:

- 1. Make a fact file by writing a biography of this person and include why they are remembered and why you chose them
- 2. Create a piece of art related to this person. You can use any materials you like. It could be flat like a portrait painting or a 3D sculpture using recycled materials
- 3. Create a game related to this person. Examples of game could be a board game, a quiz, a word search or crossword
