### Attendance Matters



Our aim is to help all children have excellent levels of attendance and punctuality. Good school attendance improves children's chance of achieving their full potential, socially, emotionally and academically.

For the Juniors, the day starts with a 'soft start' which has a positive impact on children's readiness for learning at the start of the school day. They go straight to class where they have the opportunity to organise themselves, as well as enjoy fun daily activities set by the teacher along with an emotional check-in and time to talk. The register is taken at 9:00am and the children go to collective worship led by different staff members and the clergy each day.

**Attendance:** To avoid any unauthorised absences, please contact the school if your child is unwell, if we do not hear from you it will be marked as <u>unauthorised</u>. The admin team try their best remind parents, but your help in this would be much appreciated.

Exceptional leave requests are considered, but schools do not authorise holidays taken in term time. Leave may be granted by using the <a href="Exceptional Leave Request Form">Exceptional Leave Request Form</a>. This should be given **ten days** in advance with an explanation of why the absence is exceptional and unavoidable. You will be notified of the Head of School's decision via email.

On Thursday 13<sup>th</sup> October, St. Michael's will be celebrating our Harvest Festival. We are looking for donations we can send to the local food bank.


Please send in your donations with the children, and we will store the items in the year group quiet rooms. Thank you in advance for your kind generosity.


