Helena's dad, Lucasz, came to Early Years to talk about his job as an engineer. He explained how he had helped to build the Elizabeth line and it had taken 8 years to complete. He also told us how he is helping to build the HS2 railway that will take another 10 years until it is finished. It will create another 10 lines at Euston station, it has 30,000 people working on it, will have 150 bridges and 32 miles of tunnels. It will go from London to Birmingham airport. They are also creating new nature reserves along the way and planting 7 million trees.

### INTERNET SAFETY WORKSHOPS

#### WITH MARY REBELO













- Year 1 what do we need to do when we are using our tablets , asking an adult first , who should you talk to if you are worried, scared or sad about anything you have seen, not using devices too much or before sleep time , who are your trusted adults.
- Year 2 not knowing who another player is in a game, being cautious if someone you don't know in a game asks you
  questions, being nice to each other like you would in the playground, always telling an adult if worried
- Year 3 Respect for other players online, not putting pressure on someone and accepting their friend's boundaries of time allowed online and games they are allowed to play, thinking about how what you write or emojis we use can affect others, making trades safely in a game, not answering questions from other players you don't know in real life
- Year 4 Consent and permission asking adults before we download games, do we just tick the "terms and conditions" box? why do age restrictions matter , asking friends if we can share pictures, do adults always remember to check?

  Check with a friend if they are allowed to play a certain game , being confident to say no or not give permission when you don't want to answer or play a game , blocking and reporting
- Year 5 looked at age restrictions and why they matter amount of level of content, moderation, free chat, ability to share images and videos. Terms and conditions of some popular social media sites, what can they do with your information / photos / videos , what is acceptable content? and where can it end up, rules and rights. The law around cyberbullying.
- Year 6 bullying online that targets people's identities, bodies or appearances to hurt or embarrass them. What should
  we do making the right choice not to join in, Being an upstander rather than a bystander, reporting to teachers or
  adults. Influences online sharing of hate and misogyny being discerning in looking at online content and opinions.
