



Year 6 had a very special visit this week. Award winning actress and parent Vic Hamilton very kindly attended to answer questions on her life and career as part of Year 6 English study on the art of interview writing.

Vic provided a delightful insight into the world of acting including how she started off as an actress as well as her favourite roles and films or shows, whilst highlighting the importance of following your dream.

### Talk With Year 6

On Thursday, Year 6 had an important talk from Elsa Shamash - a 95 year old refugee who came to England on the Kindertransport before the start of WW2. She started by asking the children to think about what evil was, and posed the philosophical idea that evil can only happen if good people do nothing.

She spoke for almost an hour about growing up in Berlin and the rise of the Nazi party. She described being just 6 years old when a girl from her school told her that they weren't allowed to play together anymore because she was Jewish.

She spoke of her father receiving an anonymous tip-off that the Gestapo were coming, and how he hid from them on the underground railway. If that person hadn't made the choice to do the right thing, her story could have been very different.

She spoke of coming to England at just 11 years old and the boarding school that she was sent to. She was treated differently because she was German and she thought "Here they don't want me because I am German. In Germany, they don't want me because I am Jewish."

All of the children were encapsulated in her amazing life story, and the important message of tolerance and acceptance of all peoples that she shared. Year 6 have been working hard to transcribe the interview, and will be writing an article about her. We will publish one of the articles in next week's newsletter, and make the full transcript available to anyone who wants to read more about this fascinating woman's life.


