On Thursday, Reception went on a school trip to Willow's Farm - related to our previous topic of Living Things. The children were so excited to go on their first trip and they were very sensible and grown up.















The children learnt about different farm animals, where milk comes from and even how to milk a cow! They went on a tractor ride, fed the animals and watched a very funny sheep race.



This week Year 3 have been exploring 3D shapes. We used modelling materials (Blu-tac, toothpicks and skewers) to make hexagonal prisms, cuboids and square-based pyramids, amongst other things. This helped us record the different properties of the shapes - their faces, vertices and edges.

We also made up riddles based on the properties of different 3D shapes. Can you work out what this shape is from the clues?

I have seven faces. I have ten vertices. I have fifteen edges. What am I?




