# LEARNING TO CODE USING MICRO BITS




### With Year 6 and Mary Rebelo


A micro:bit is a tiny pocket sized computer. A micro:bit is for children to learn about the ways that software and hardware work together. Software describes the digital information that helps computers to run – for example, the apps on a mobile phone are a type of software. Hardware is the physical parts of a computer that allow the software to work. For example, this might include a motherboard. The Year 6's learned about how a computer works by coding different events and functions on their micro:bits- for example, they creating an electronic beating heart, a dancing robot and a digital dice!




