A visit in March 23 by our School Improvement Partner also reported "The use of a significant amount of IT and a strong computing offer is **enriching the pupil's learning experiences.**" Good to know: Online safety is a key part of our safeguarding approach. We work with parents to monitor time pupils spend online, keep to update with potentially detrimental games being released and run educational events for parents. 










Congratulations to the winner of the REFERRE COMPETITION



Year 6 Science Skills
