

EYFS People Who Help Us


An agile coach came in to talk to the Early Years about her job.

Key Stage 1 and Reception had a visit from our community police officers. They explained their role, equipment and how they keep us safe.








Etna Class gave a great assembly demonstrating the aims of the LGBT History Month which were to promote equality and diversity remembering how changes have been made over the years to people's rights.











As part of our **STEAM** week activities - St Michael's is going to work in partnership with a series of schools in Chilomoni, Malawi. The main theme of our Steam Week this year is **Sustainability**. With this in mind we are looking to gather together previously used resources and share them with others.

Working with the charity **'Cycle of Good'** we would like to send filled pencil cases for the children at school in Chilomoni to use. These pencil cases are handmade in Malawi using recycled bicycle inner tubes. Here is the idea:

- Each class within St Michael's will be provided with a set of pencil cases.
 Our aim is to fill them with USED stationary items including pens, pencils, crayons, felt tips, rulers, sharpeners etc.
- · Please do not go out and buy any thing new!
- Make sure everything you add in is in usable condition, is sharpened or has lids.
- At the end of STEAM week we will have a school's worth of pencil cases that I will arrange to have sent to Malawi from the children.

Please have a search at home, in drawers, art sets, old pencil cases around the house and see what you can find.

I have been lucky enough to teach a reception class for a year in the Township where these pencil cases will go, and have seen first hand how much these donations can have a positive impact upon the children's learning which is why I am so pleased that St Michael's can support this initiative.


