






Year 1 Aoraki


Year 6 Eiger

SMSA (St Michael's School Association)

We are also very fortunate to be supported by your parent-led fundraising body, the SMSA. The differences between the Learning Fund and the SMSA are summarised below. The school needs funds from both sources to be able to continue what we do.

	St Michael's Learning Fund Previously 'The Governors Fund'	SMSA St Michael's School Association
What is this?	Charitable trust that raises essential funds to maintain and improve your school. All voluntary aided schools (typically faith schools) have to raise funds from their community in this way. Your Governors are trustees of the fund, which is subject to regulation by the Charity Commission.	Parent-led body that runs social events throughout the school year for children and parents, to bring the community together and raise funds. A registered charity, subject to regulations by the Charity Commission.
How is the money raised spent?	A rolling program of essential works to our buildings, classrooms and grounds, as well as additional projects that make our school exceptional (e.g. our school library, and our digital offer).	Additional items to enrich our children's learning e.g. KS1 reading shed, classroom resources and new climbing frames.
How can parents contribute?	Regular contribution via standing order of £10, £20 or £40 a month; or more if you are in a position to do so. We also invite Y6 parents to make a one-off legacy donation to commemorate your child's time at St Michael's and to help other children have the same opportunities your child has benefitted from.	By continuing to support class cake sales, school fairs, and other special events including quiz nights, bonfire night and sponsored sports events throughout the year.

The Learning Fund is the name given to the charity registered with the Charity Commission under the number 312451 and with the formal name Highgate St Michael's National School. The SMSA is the name given to the charity registered with the Charity Commission under the number 1076564 and with the formal name St. Michael's School Association. We have some exciting news for you! We are taking part in the 15th year celebration of Sustrans Big Walk and Wheel, the UK's largest inter-school cycling, walking, wheeling and scooting challenge. The challenge runs from 11-22 March 2024. It's free to take part and we would love everyone to be involved.

What do you need to do?

Encourage your child(ren) to walk, use a wheelchair, scoot or cycle to school on as many days as possible during the event.

Including everyone

We want to make sure that everyone can get involved in Sustrans Big Walk and Wheel. We know it may be more difficult for some pupils to take part than others. If you want to discuss more about your child(ren)'s specific needs, please contact Mr Houghton and he will make sure to look into how your child(ren) can take part.

Why we are taking part

Sustrans Big Walk and Wheel is a great way to build physical activity in children's daily routine which is important for their physical health and mental wellbeing.

Active school runs also help to reduce congestion and air pollution outside the school gate. A 2021 YouGov study showed nearly half of UK children worry about air pollution near their school. And that children thought active travel was the best way to bring down these pollution levels. Plus, there are some great prizes to be won every day if we get enough children taking part!
