



School attendance

Every day at <u>school</u> counts. The evidence is clear - even a few days of missed school can have a significant impact on a child's education and future prospects.

Children who miss school may:

- fall behind with their work
- not perform as well in exams

By law, children aged 5 to 16 must receive a suitable full-time education.

It's up to you as a parent or guardian to make sure they attend regularly.

The school have the legal power to issue a penalty if your child does not go to school regularly.

Help with attendance

If your child is struggling to go to school, here are some ways to help them:

- make sure they understand the importance of going to school
- discuss problems they may have and let school know about anything serious
- do not let them take time off school for minor problems
- arrange appointments and outings outside of school hours

Nursery

In Nursery we are learning all about Japan for World Heritage Day.

We all made art inspired by the Japanese artist Yasoi Kusama which will be displayed for all to see.







The children in Uluru have had a wonderful week exploring their different heritages and learning new languages!

The wonderful Oopsie spoke to the class about her heritage and where she was from in Thailand. Oopsie taught the children how to write simple words in Thai, such as mum, dad, hello and goodbye. She also taught the children how to say the different phrases.

We also had a parent volunteer to come in to share their heritage, and the wonders of Cyprus. They taught the children about the rich heritage and history of Cyprus, and explored the Greek language. The children were even given a taste of the traditional food!

The cooks were all boys this week who compared their muscles when mixing all of the ingredients together so vigorously.

When the cakes were cooked we decorated them with icing sugar and sprinkles. The children enjoyed eating them at snack time and delivered some extra cakes to some of the teachers in the school























Machu Picchu were lucky enough to have a visit from police officers who spoke about their job and the equipment they need to help people. The children enjoyed asking lots of questions and passing around their hat and handcuffs.













This term, Year 1 has been diving into the history of toys!

They had the fantastic opportunity to take part in a toy workshop, where they could touch, feel, and play with historical toys from various eras, including the Victorian period. With the help of our lovely parent volunteers, they even crafted their own selection of toys. What a brilliant day!



















































For World Heritage Day Year 2 Everest have been learning all about Argentina. They wrote travel guide leaflets in English and learnt about Welsh settlers in Patagonia. For their significant person, Everest class chose the late Pope Francis.

They made portraits of Francis inspired by the work of Andy Warhol.







In K2 we learned all about Columbia. We looked at some of the major cities and the various carnivals and celebrations. In addition we learned about Shakira, listening to her music and drawing her portrait. We produced fact sheets about Columbia, and created some carnival masks.









In between finishing off their KS1 SATs assessments Year 2 have been learning all about what plants need to germinate and grow.

We tried growing several different plants to varying degrees of success.

Our beans didn't grow but our tomatoes (grown from a cut up tomato) have done quite well.









This week, Year 3 have created art pieces based on the Australian artist Emily Kame Kngwarreye. Here are our incredible pieces of art.













Year 3 were inspired by the work of Emily Kame
Kngwarreye to create these stunning abstract paintings.
Kngwarreye was an aboriginal Australian artist inspired
by her landscape and culture. She started painting when
she was in her seventies and produced over 3000 works
before her death at age 86.
















For World Heritage Day, many Year 3 children created an information poster about Australia. Some made the poster about Australia in general, whilst others chose to focus on a specific topic such as animals, landmarks, sport or an Australian person that they admire.



This week we have been learning about Scandinavian folk art which includes motifs inspired by nature. We linked our learning to Greta Thunberg who is a significant person from Sweden, she is an activist who inspires use to think careful about nature and our planet.









Every day at 3pm a small group of children from Year 4 visit Reception and Nursery to read them a short story.

This helps build confidence and oracy skills and it is good for the younger children to see the older children showing off their reading skills.







In celebration of World Heritage Day, Year 5 focused on Japan.

We had a great time exploring Hokusai's famous piece, "The Great Wave," and using collage techniques with all sorts of materials to create our own interpretations.

We also carried out our own research to learn more about this amazing country!



















Junior Road Watch

Today, we met some Police Officers. They told us we would be measuring people's speed. Wearing high-vis jackets, we went outside onto North Road. We crossed the road and one of the policemen gave us the speed gun. We used the speed gun to see if drivers were going over 20mph. If they were, the police would stop them and we asked some questions like "Why were you speeding?" or "Do you know the risks of speeding?"

Everyone had 2 turns, and then we went back to school with a keyring to remember the day.

Eggs




