

## Nursery



In Nursery this week our theme is boats and shapes.

The children have created boats from 2D shapes, 3D shapes, Numicon and recycled materials.

This week, Reception made summer vegetable tarts in cooking.

We made the sauce by blending roasted tomatoes and basil together, and then we chopped up lots of lovely fresh veg and put it in the oven to cook. Once cooked, we put some basil on top.

## Reception

We've had a fun week learning more about maps.
The children hid an item around the playground and made their own treasure map for a partner to follow and find it!

We also investigated Weight, and made foil boats.

The children made lots of different shapes and sizes and tested them in our water tray using marbles.

















Year 1 has been busy, busy indeed! In Maths, the children explored mass and volume through hands-on activities using scales. They measured, recorded, and compared a variety of classroom objects, developing both their reasoning and measuring skills.

In English, they wrapped up their work on the Indian tale Pattan's Pumpkin by writing their own news reports. They then let their creativity shine by designing pumpkins inspired by the distinctive style of Japanese artist Yayoi Kusama.

As part of our Topic lessons, the children have been learning all about the seaside. They imagined their own seaside adventures and designed colourful, creative postcards to match.

They have been shining bright and are definitely showing they're ready for the leap into Year 2!



































Year 2 celebrated having some of their creative writing published in a book! They were selected for publication in a Young Writers Anthology of poetry.

Year 2 had an amazing time at London Zoo, which we visited as a combined Geography and Science visit. We have been learning about habitats and camouflage in Science and in Geography, we have been learning about the tropics as well as building on our Year 1 learning about polar exploration. We were so excited to see the baby gorillas Juno and Venus but for many the highlight were the capybaras who were visiting on their way to Whipsnade Zoo. By the end of the trip we were all as tried as sloths.

These trips would not happen without your support.












#### **Year 3 Science**

In their Science topic, Year 3 have been exploring magnets. This week they observed how the opposite poles of a magnet attract each other and the like poles repel.











Year 3 have been enjoying listening to the BFG by Roald Dahl. They have now reached the chapter, 'Dream-Catching' and have drawn and described a dream of their own.

That remains to be seen...















Year 4 are embarking on their last creative writing piece of the year. They are planning a magical story where they learn how to fly, and are using thesauruses and "descriptosauruses" to find some fabulous vocabulary.





Year 4 are wrapping up their RE journey this year with a visit to St Alban's cathedral. We took part in two workshops.

First, the children learned about the life of a monk, and were rather grateful that they did not have to get up at 2am for handwriting practice.

After lunch we took part in an illuminated lettering workshop where we learned about how before the arrival of the printing press all books were written by hand and everyone's handwriting had to be exactly the same. It was extremely difficult!

We finished the day with a tour of the cathedral and grounds.









Our Year 4 trip to St Albans Cathedral was fascinating. We learned about the lives of monks and nuns who worked hard in the scriptorium, carefully copying manuscripts by hand. The historic building amazed us, and we imagined what life was like in medieval times. It was truly unforgettable!













Year 5 have been applying all their calculation and decimals skills in their current Converting Units topic. They measured all sorts of things in the playground, using one unit of measure and then converting into other units.


