Message from the Chair of Governors Fundraising Working Group

Dear Parents and Carers,

Last week I wrote to thank all members of our school community who have helped to realise our vision for the school in 2025.

The next phase of our school and site improvement works will be upgrading the Key Stage 2 classrooms, starting with Year 6.

The works to the front of our site, including the new Early Years classrooms and playground, have significantly depleted the reserves held in the Learning Fund- the charitable trust that raises essential funds to maintain and improve our school buildings (NB the Learning Fund works in collaboration with, but is distinct from, the SMSA, our wonderful parent-led body that runs social events throughout the school year to bring the community together and raise funds for additional enrichment opportunities for our children).

To upgrade the older children's classrooms, Governors need to increase fundraising to the Learning Fund, including looking beyond our school community at grants and match-funding initiatives.

To achieve this, we are seeking a parent volunteer from each Key Stage to join with Governors to form a Fundraising Working Group.





Year 1 has been busy! In Maths, they've explored numbers and number words, and have been practising number formation in fun, creative ways.

In Art, they designed their own feathers for a vibrant classroom display and created beautiful mosaic-style crosses for our windows.

In Science, they've been learning weather vocabulary and making predictions about the seasons ahead. There are definitely sunny days ahead in their learning journey!















In Art this week, we looked at the work of London artist Bridget Riley. We learnt about different types of lines - straight, wavy, curved, zigzag - as well as pressure and control. We experimented with different materials to create our own art.

Year 3 have been making persuasive posters to encourage more visitors to Abdul Kazam's amazing magic show. Look out for the imperative verbs and rhetorical questions as well as colourful and impactful images.

Year 4 have started their new Science topic: State of Matter.

They've been exploring how solids, liquids and gases behave and asking insightful questions such as "Is melting ice a liquid or a solid?" and "Is whipped cream a solid?".

In Year 4, we have been learning about the Roman's contributions to Londonium and how our class Tube Stations were originally part of the London defensive wall. To commemorate this, we created our own Roman mosaic artwork and haiku poems.

We have also started reading the Firework Maker's Daughter in English this week. In addition to learning how fireworks are made, we used oil pastels to create our own artwork with fireworks over city and jungle landscapes.















Shoreditch class were inspired by the artist Nek Chand to create our own artwork using natural materials that we discovered around the school grounds. We had lots of fun designing faces and animals out of conkers, bark, twigs, and other found objects.













Year 5 Finsbury Park spent a morning in our namesake open space, a short bus ride away. We explored the many and ancient trees of the park, taking photos of all the rich nature the park has to offer.

Then, inspired by the artist Nek Chand, we created pictures of people using found materials. We hope you like the results.













In Art, we explored photomontage, inspired by pioneering artist Hannah Höch, who created some of the first works over 100 years ago.

Our Safeguarding Superheroes







Do you know a boy who enjoys learning music and singing?










It's a chance to learn new musical skills, and be part of a special musical team as a chorister in the Temple Church.
