Message from the Chair of Governors Fundraising Working Group

Dear Parents and Carers,

Last week I wrote to thank all members of our school community who have helped to realise our vision for the school in 2025.

The next phase of our school and site improvement works will be upgrading the Key Stage 2 classrooms, starting with Year 6.

The works to the front of our site, including the new Early Years classrooms and playground, have significantly depleted the reserves held in the Learning Fund- the charitable trust that raises essential funds to maintain and improve our school buildings (NB the Learning Fund works in collaboration with, but is distinct from, the SMSA, our wonderful parent-led body that runs social events throughout the school year to bring the community together and raise funds for additional enrichment opportunities for our children).

To upgrade the older children's classrooms, Governors need to increase fundraising to the Learning Fund, including looking beyond our school community at grants and match-funding initiatives.

To achieve this, we are seeking a parent volunteer from each Key Stage to join with Governors to form a Fundraising Working Group.







What a wonderful start to the year it's been!
























Over the past few weeks Year 2 have been studying 'Wild' by Emily Hughes.


They have learned the storm by heart, written it in their own words and made innovations to the story.


By changing the setting and animals involved they have made the stories their own.




In PSHE, the children have been discussing what makes a good school.

They have used several persuasive techniques to convince Leon. For their final piece they published their letters in their neatest handwriting ready for a beautiful class display.












This week, Year 4 have been working really hard during their Michaelmas rehearsals to learn their lines and lyrics ahead of their Friday church service.

Year 5 Shoreditch enjoyed a wonderful trip to the library this week, exploring new books, recommending favourites to each other, and learning how to find information.











She had to climb to the very top branch and hang the necklace around the top so the sun could hit it at sunset.


She waited all day. When the sun struck the necklace, the brightest light in the world shone on the leaves.

Junior Road Watch


Some Year 6 children had an important job this week –




