



Night Owls




By popular demand, Night Owls brought back their much-loved pancake session — and it was an even bigger hit this time!

A week full of colour, creativity, and imagination!




















The story is about a family where each member has different skin tones, hair types, and facial features. Aida spoke to the children about how people in the same family can look different because of genetics—but that everyone is loved just the same. It was a beautiful and important message that really inspired the children!




In RE year 2 have been studying the Lord's Prayer. We have looked at the different forms of prayer and broken down the Lord's Prayer line by line. This week we have examined the line 'lead us not into temptation' linking it to our UNICEF rights of the child.









Our Year 3 children have been exploring yoga, flexibility, and relaxation this term. They've enjoyed learning a variety of poses that help improve balance, strength, and focus while discovering how movement can support their wellbeing.









As part of Black History Month, both Year 4 classes have been learning about Dr Anne-Marie Imafidon, an influential computer scientist and mathematician. She also started a group called STEMettes to encourage girls and young people get into STEM careers.

This week we've taken inspiration from Dr Imafidon to build up our coding skills by learning about how to write our names in binary. For homework, we have created zines (mini magazines) to teach our peers about other influential Black British people or new skills.
















Year 5 are enjoying a unit of Tag Rugby this term.

scoring hatfuls of tries.














Year 6 students have beenworking hard this week, and getting used to the format of the KS2 SATs!

Welcome to your lost property!

Many lost items are left outside and quickly become wet or soiled by foxes. Once the items are placed into the green lost property bins, it leaves searching through them undesirable.

The team collects, launders and lists all lost **uniform** items every Sunday on Classlist. The following week, all **named** items are distributed directly back to your child in their classroom.

Please don't try to collect from the school office.

Unnamed lost property can be claimed in the comment box, below the weekly Classlist post. Collection is the following Friday in the top playground, at the donations table (8.40-9am).

All lost property remains lost property until it's either: claimed, donated to St. Michael's Preloved (the school's second hand uniform service), or it has been left unclaimed until the end of term and then it is automatically donated to Preloved, to sell.

All money raised goes directly to the school.


