




















#### Nursery

We then performed them in the library.




Year 3 had an amazing time stepping back into the Stone Age at Celtic Harmony Camp!

#### Tips on how to stay safe online in the classroom:

- Only click on links that have https\_at the start or links your teacher has provided.
- Don't give out personal information. EG: Your password, birthday, name or address.
- Only talk to people that you know.
- Speak to an adult if anything worries you.







#### Welcome to your lost property!

Many lost items are left outside and quickly become wet or soiled by foxes. Once the items are placed into the green lost property bins, it leaves searching through them undesirable.

The team collects, launders and lists all lost **uniform** items every Sunday on Classlist. The following week, all **named** items are distributed directly back to your child in their classroom.

Please don't try to collect from the school office.

**Unnamed** lost property can be claimed in the comment box, below the weekly Classlist post. Collection is the following Friday in the top playground, at the donations table (8.40-9am).

All lost property remains lost property until it's either: claimed, donated to St. Michael's Preloved (the school's second hand uniform service), or it has been left unclaimed until the end of term and then it is automatically donated to Preloved, to sell.

All money raised goes directly to the school.

Under no circumstances is lost property ever sold.
