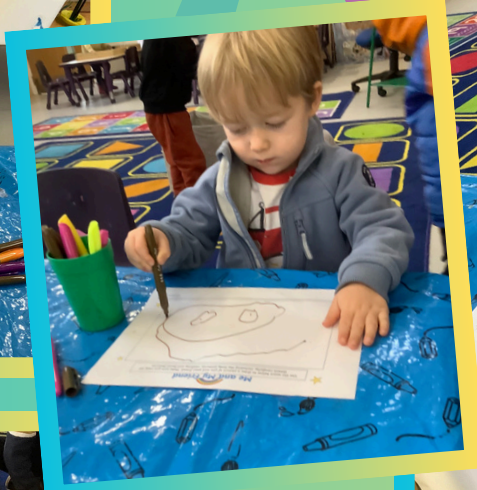




Nursery



This week in Nursery we have been learning about friendship and kindness. The children drew pictures of the kind things our friends and family do for us and also the kind things we do in return.

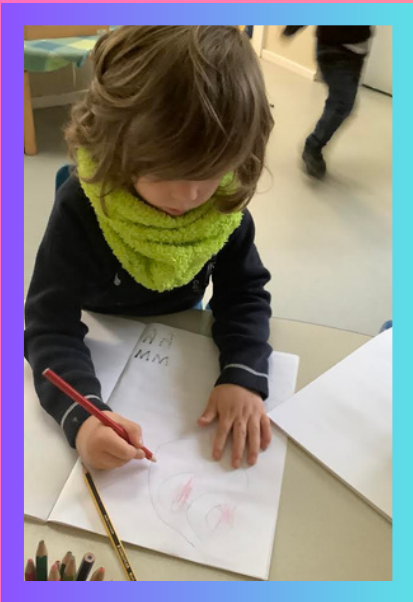
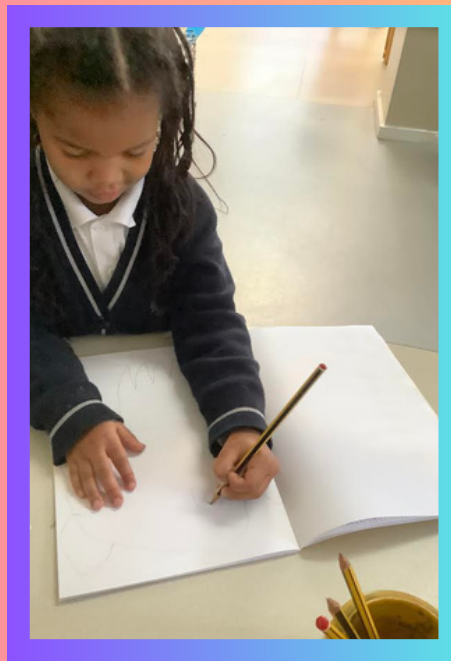




Reception

Night Owls

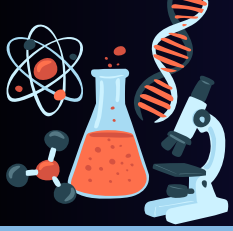


In Night Owls, the children have been getting creative with an animal theme.

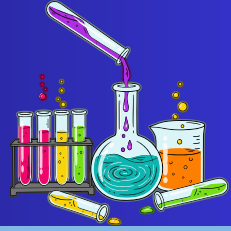

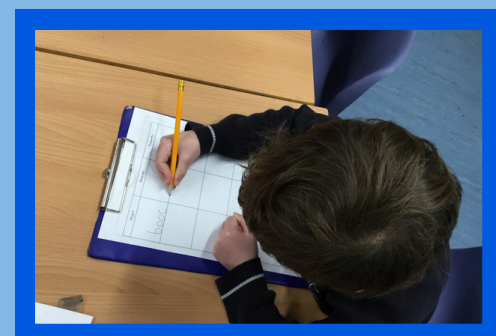




Year 1

We have been inspired by the way Hannah Dunnett uses calligraphy in her art and we have incorporated some verses of the Bible to embellish our painting.

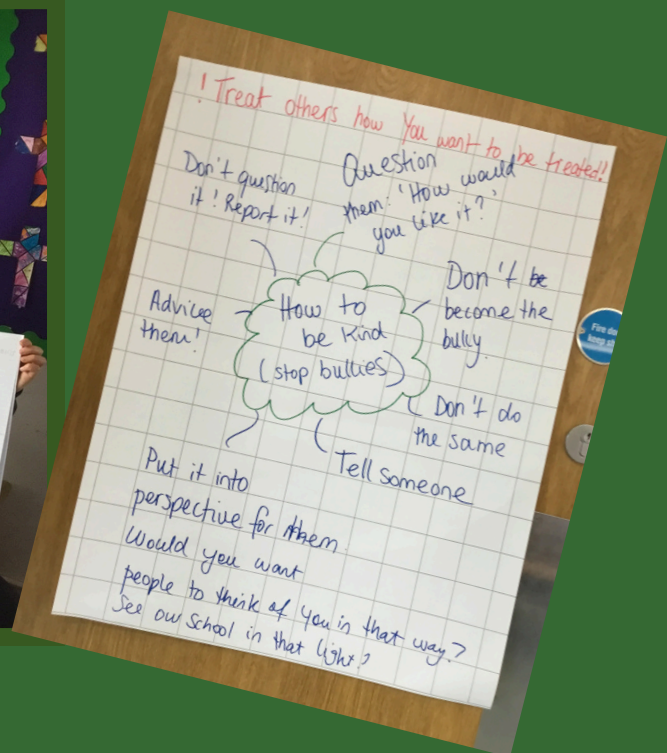
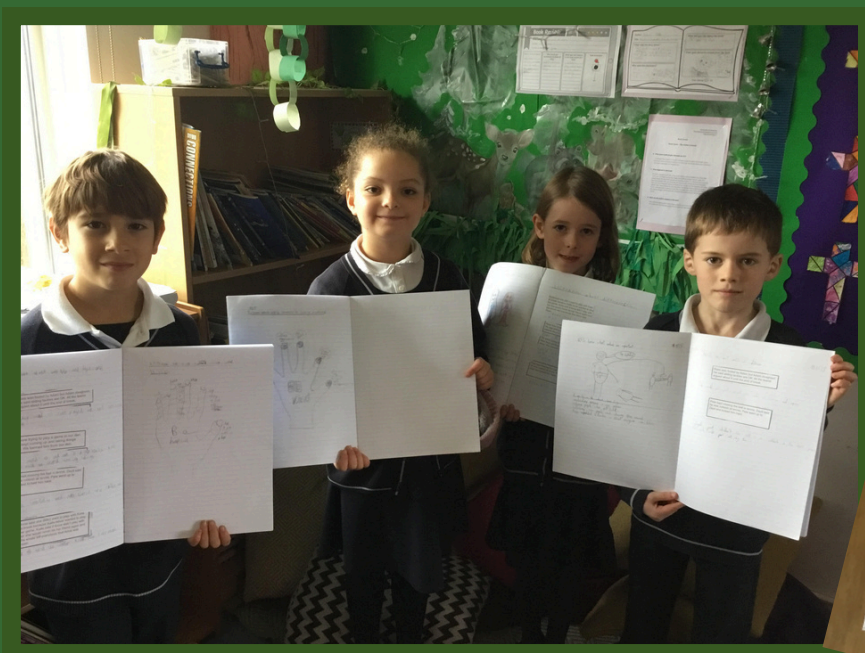


Year 3

We also have discussed the differences and conflicts that can happen within families and friendships and we practised positive strategies to solve problems respectfully and calmly.

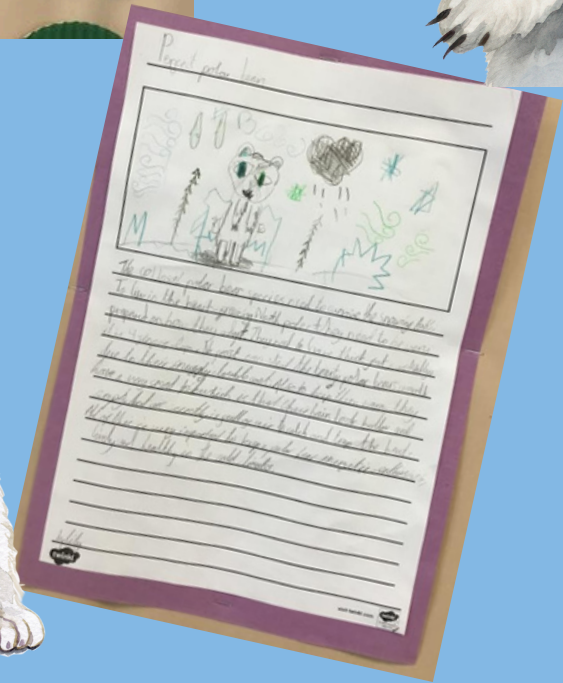
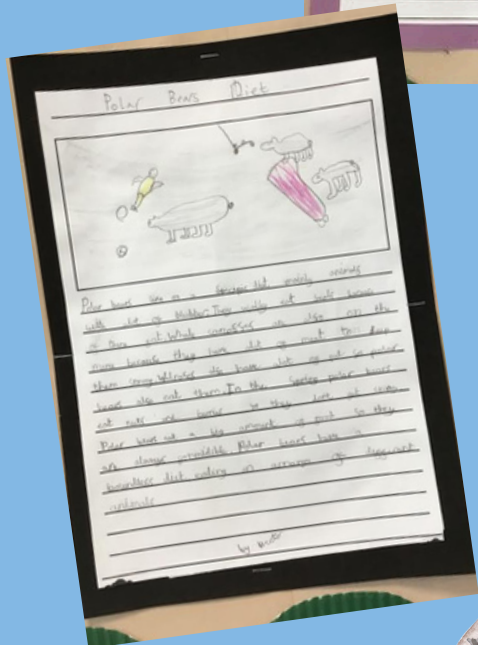
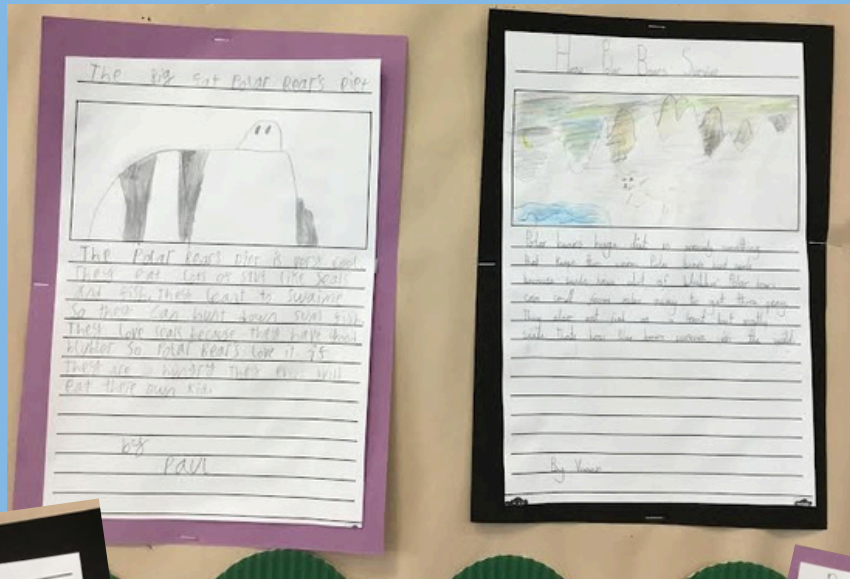
Year 3 have shown fantastic maturity and thoughtfulness during these sessions!

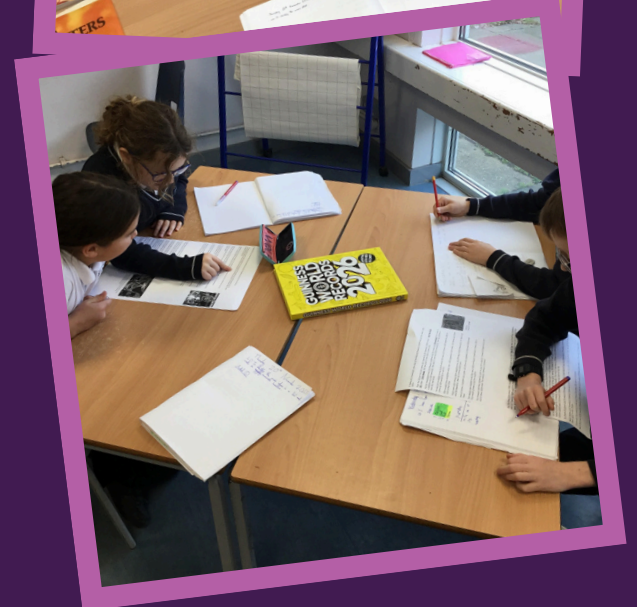
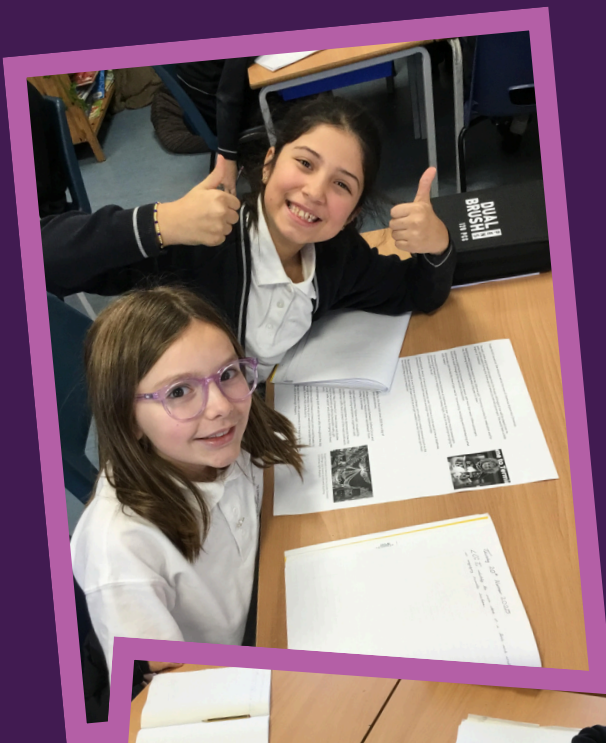


Year 5

Broadband Controls

It is advisable to begin by setting up parental controls through your broadband provider. This is the most effective first step in filtering out inappropriate or harmful content before it reaches any devices connected to your home network.



Device Settings

Many devices offer family management or parental control options, allowing you to monitor screen time, restrict access to certain apps, and manage online activity across your children's devices.

Reunite

Welcome to your lost property!

Many lost items are left outside and quickly become wet or soiled by foxes. Once the items are placed into the green lost property bins, it leaves searching through them undesirable.

The team collects, launders and lists all lost **uniform** items every Sunday on Classlist. The following week, all **named** items are distributed directly back to your child in their classroom.

Please don't try to collect from the school office.

Unnamed lost property can be claimed in the comment box, below the weekly Classlist post. Collection is the following Friday in the top playground, at the donations table (8.40-9am).

All lost property remains lost property until it's either: claimed, donated to St. Michael's Preloved (the school's second hand uniform service), or it has been left unclaimed until the end of term and then it is automatically donated to Preloved, to sell.

All money raised goes directly to the school.

Under no circumstances is lost property ever sold.
