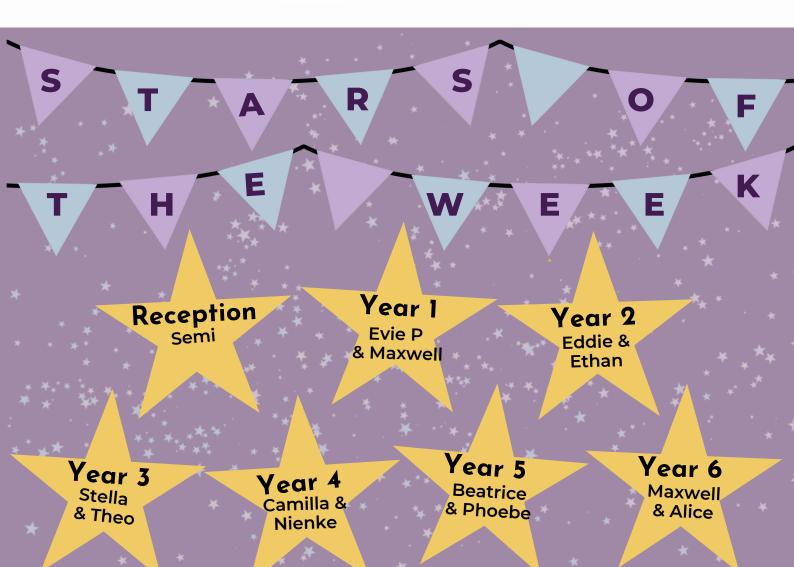

We have learnt all about Guy Fawkes this week. For bonfire night, the children made firework art using straws, paint and glitter. There were lots of lovely different designs!



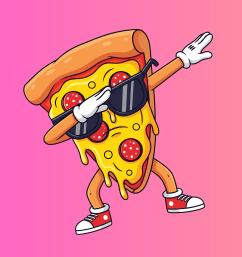

The children shared what they had learnt and Mary Seacole was impressed by all the information the children had remembered.







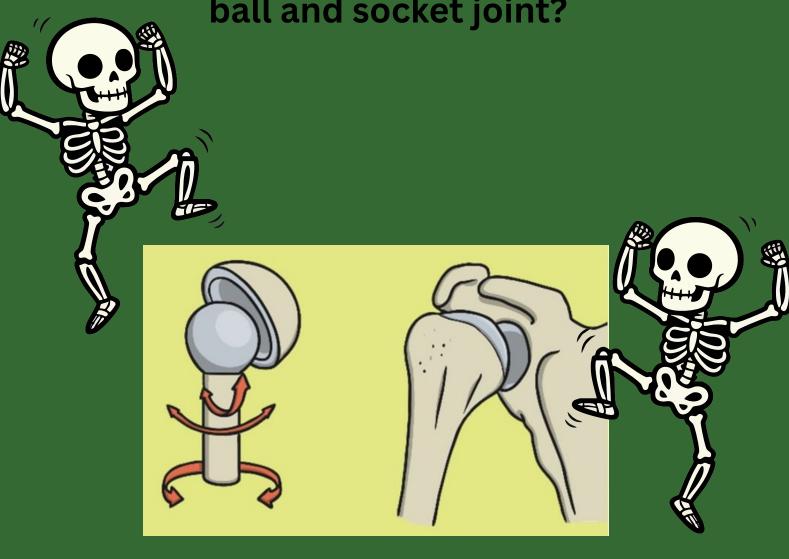


Year 3 Science

Do you know where in your body you have a ball and socket joint?

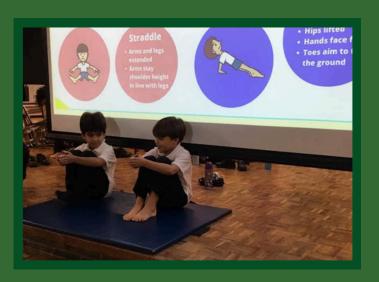

Year 6 Art

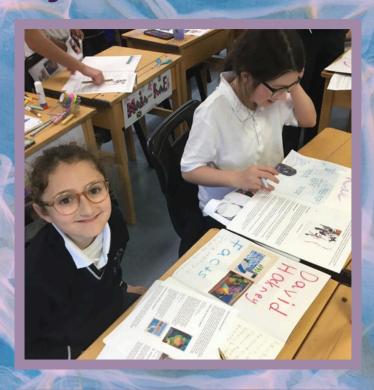
This half term our topic in Art is artist study.

UK Safer Internet Centre

Broadband Controls

It is advisable to begin by setting up parental controls through your broadband provider. This is the most effective first step in filtering out inappropriate or harmful content before it reaches any devices connected to your home network.

Device Settings

Many devices offer family management or parental control options, allowing you to monitor screen time, restrict access to certain apps, and manage online activity across your children's devices.

Welcome to your lost property!

Many lost items are left outside and quickly become wet or soiled by foxes. Once the items are placed into the green lost property bins, it leaves searching through them undesirable.

The team collects, launders and lists all lost **uniform** items every Sunday on Classlist. The following week, all **named** items are distributed directly back to your child in their classroom.

Please don't try to collect from the school office.

Unnamed lost property can be claimed in the comment box, below the weekly Classlist post. Collection is the following Friday in the top playground, at the donations table (8.40-9am).

All lost property remains lost property until it's either: claimed, donated to St. Michael's Preloved (the school's second hand uniform service), or it has been left unclaimed until the end of term and then it is automatically donated to Preloved, to sell.

All money raised goes directly to the school.

Under no circumstances is lost property ever sold.
